ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar National Law University (earlier known as National Law University Haryana), Rai, Sonepat (hereinafter abbreviated as DBRANLU) was established by the State Government of Haryana in the year 2012 vide State Legislature Act No. 15 of 2012.

As a tribute to Bharat Ratna Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, a great visionary, social reformer and architect of our present legal system and craftsman of our Constitution, the State Legislature of Haryana through an amendment in 2014, changed the name of the University to Dr. B.R. Ambedkar National Law University, Rai, Sonepat. A state-of-the-art campus is under construction in the education hub of India - Rajiv Gandhi Education City, Rai, Sonepat falling under National Capital Region - where more than thirteen renowned educational institutions/ Universities are located and some of these are already functional. The location provides a positive and congenial environment for legal education and professional training besides overall development of students. It is well connected by Air, Rail and Road to all major points of State and the Nation with a distance of approx. 30 KMs from National Capital Delhi, and approx. 215 KMs. from State Capital Chandigarh. The University has been inspected by the Bar Council of India (BCI) in December, 2019. It got registered with the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi under Section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956. Presently DBRANLU offers the following Course:

B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Five-Year Integrated Course

This Programme is interdisciplinary in nature and follows the Semester System wherein Social Sciences subjects like Economics, English, Hindi, Sanskrit, History, Political Science and Sociology are taught along with Law subjects in the first two years of study. From third year onwards, the curriculum comprises of all Law subjects. All subjects are compulsory in the first three years, in the fourth and fifth year; students are offered specializations in six streams, viz., Business Law, Constitutional Law, Criminal Law, International Law, Family Law, and Labour Law. In addition, the University is focusing on other specific areas like, Rent Laws, Taxation Law, Cyber & IT Law, Law and Agriculture, Environment Law, Human Right, Alternative Dispute Resolution & Legal Aid, Health Laws, Woman and Law, Forensic Law, Banking Law, International Trade Law, Media and Law, Law of Insurance etc. including virtual/class room teaching. The successful students are awarded B.A.LL.B. (Honours) Degree with specialization.

The teaching methodology is holistic which includes extensive and intensive class room teaching with emphasis on participative practical learning. The Courses include assignments, symposium, seminars, field visits and project works.

The course is design to keep in view the balanced requirements of the society as well as Industry with the pragmatic professionalism and research based teaching-learning inputs.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

The Admission is based on the merit through the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT). However, to qualify for admission:-


 The candidate must have passed 10+2 examination of the Board of School Education, Haryana or its equivalent State/Central Board with minimum 45% marks in the aggregate (40% marks for SC/ST candidates)

The allocation of the candidates to DBRNLU, Sonepat by the CLAT Authority through the Centralised Admission process shall be provisional subject to verification of original certificates / testimonials and documents by DBRANLU. Therefore, candidates are required to submit admission form available in the DRBANLU Prospectus alongwith the attested copies of the documents/certificates.
- 4. The Candidates are required to produce original Certificates / Documents on the date of the interview/ counselling. Failure to produce Certificate / Documents in original shall result in cancellation of their candidature.
- Conversion of reserved seats into general category: In case of 5. non-availability of candidate in reserve category, the vacant seat(s) shall be converted as under: (i) On non-availability of a ST candidate, the seat shall be converted into the SC Category, (ii) On non availability of SC candidate, the seat shall be converted into General Category, (iii) On non availability of DSC candidate, the seat shall be converted into SC Category, (iv) On non-availability of a EWS Category candidate, the seat shall be converted into the General Category, (v) On non-availability of WL category candidate, the seat shall be converted into the UR-HR Category, (vi) In the event of quota reserved for PWD remain unutilized due to non availability for suitable category of handicapped candidates, it shall be offered to the Ex-servicemen and their wards and the dependents of Freedom Fighters as per Haryana Govt. Reservation Policy.
- Dr. B. R. Ambedkar National Law University started its first academic session from July 2019 by admitting first batch of B.A.LL.B. (Hons.). It has started its functioning from its interim location at Shri Balwant Singh Institute of Technology (SBIT), Meerut Road Pallri, Sonepat.

Boys and Girls Hostels are under the overall supervision of the Chief Warden. He is assisted by the team of Wardens and Hostel Supervisors. All admitted students have to reside in University Hostels.

Hostels are constructed on the latest modern pattern. These are equipped with all facilities and equipped with neat & clean mess/dining facilities. Hostels have 07 floors which are approachable through lift and stairs. Needs of Specially Abled Persons are also kept in consideration and hostels are comfortable and accomodable for them. Hostels have rooms for both single accommodation and doubleaccommodation. The rooms are allotted as per the policy of DBRANLU. There are recreational facilities for the hostlers like Table-Tennis Boards, Televisions, Carrom Boards etc.
