How? | Rural development processes have a strong social psychological component that entails that psychological knowledge is crucial for rural development agents. Nevertheless, psychological knowledge has also been criticised for simplifying highly complex development processes and overstating the role of internal psychological factors. Psychology, particularly community psychology and social psychology, has great potential for contributing to rural development processes, both in terms of prevention and intervention. However, the contributions made to this field by this discipline are scarce, and their impact has been limited. In fact, psychology has not even been mentioned as a relevant science in the context of development studies, where social disciplines such as sociology, anthropology and geography, among others, have a prominent role. |
